

Windows 10 over Windows 11

I'll catch up on website work, music, new writing, enjoying sunshine, birds at the feeder, birds in the air, birds and insects on the lawn, outside existence as spring plays its games with weather in eastern Oregon, everything of daily living, everything.

I also research, a little at a time, how to run Linux with Windows 10, for a smaller operating system and for better security. I think I might do that, but it will be a while before I take any steps toward it.
